

All construction related activities, including grade alteration, excavation, soil compaction, any materials or equipment storage, disposal of liquid and vehicular traffic are NOT permitted within this TPZ.

This tree protection barrier must remain in good condition and must not be removed or altered without authorization of City of Toronto, Urban Forestry.

Tree Inventory


Refer to Table 1 of report dated 28 May 2020, revised 9 December 2021 for complete tree inventory information. Trees greater than 15cm DBH on and within six metres of the subject properties and trees of all sizes within road right-of-way were Included In the Inventory.

Tree Removals

The removal of 9 trees is required to accommodate the proposed development as indicated with RED labels.

Tree Preservation

Preservation of the remaining 11 trees will be possible. Trees identified for preservation are indicated with GREEN labels. Tree Preservation Zone (TPZ) circles represent minimum distances for construction and grading near trees, respecting City of Toronto Private Tree By-law. Refer to Tree Protection Plan Notes for preservation details.



- It is the applicants' responsibility to discuss potential impacts to trees located near or wholly on adjacent properties or on shared boundary lines with their neighbours. Should such trees be injured to the point of instability or death the applicant may be held responsible through civil action. The applicant would also be required to replace such trees to the assistaction of Unian Forestry.
- Tree protection barriers shall be installed to standards as detailed in this document and to the satisfaction of Urban Forestry.
- Tree protection barriers must be installed using plywood clad hoarding (minimum 19mm or ¾" thick) or an
 equivalent approved by Urban Forestry.
- Where required, signs as specified in Section 4, Tree Protection Signage must be attached to all sides of the barrier.
- Prior to the commencement of any site activity such as site alteration, demolition or construction, the tree
 protection measures specified on this plan must be installed to the satisfaction of Urban Forestry.
- Once all free/site protection measures have been installed, Urban Forestry staff must be contacted to arrar
 for an inspection of the site and approval of the tree/site protection requirements. Photographs that clearly
 show the installed tree/site protection shall be provided for Urban Forestry preview.
- Where changes to the location of the approved TPZ or sediment control or where temporary access to the TP is proposed. Urban Forestry must be contacted to obtain approval prior to alteration.
- Tree protection barriers must remain in place and in good condition during demolition, construction and/or sit disturbance, including landscaping, and must not be altered, moved or removed until authorized by Urban Forestry.
- No construction activities including grade changes, surface treatments or excavation of any kind are permitted
 within the area identified on the Tree Protection Flow or Site Plans as a minimum tree protection zone (TPZ). No
 root cutting is permitted. No storage of materials or fill is permitted within the TPZ. No movement or storage of
 vehicles or equipment is permitted within the TPZ. The area(s) identified as a TPZ must be protected and
 remain undisturbed at all times.
- All additional tree protection or preservation requirements, above and beyond the installation of tree protection barriers, must be undertaken or implemented as detailed in the Urban Forestry approved arborist report and/or the approved tree protection plan and to the satisfaction of Urban Forestry.

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- If the minimum tree protection zone (TPZ) must be reduced to facilitate construction access, the tree protect
 barriers must be maintained at a lesser distance and the exposed portion of TPZ must be protected using a
 horizonatir oot protection method approved by Untain Foresty.
- Any roots or branches indicated on this plan with require pruning, as approved by Urban Forestry, must be pruned by an arborist. All pruning of tree notes and branches must be in accordance with good arboriscultural practice. Roots that have received approval from Urban Forestry to be pruned must first be exposed using pneumatic (air) excavation, by hand digging or by a using low pressure hydraulic (water) excavation. The water pressure for hydraulic executions must be low encough that root baris in not diamaged or removed. This will all a proper pruning cut and minimize tearing of the roots. The arborist retained to carry out covers not optuning must contact Urban Forestry on less than three vorhing days prior to conducting any specified work.
- The applicant/owner shall protect all by-law regulated trees in the area of consideration that have not be approved for removal throughout development works to the satisfaction of Urban Forestry.
- Convictions of offences respecting the regulations in the Street Tree By-law and Private Tree By-law are subject to fines. A person convicted of an offence under these by-laws is liable to a minimum fine of \$500 and maximum fine of \$100,000 per tree, and for a Special Fine of \$100,000. The landowner may be ordered by the City to stop the contravening activity or ordered to undertake work to correct the contravention.
- Prior to site disturbance the owner must confirm that no migratory birds are making use of the site for nesting.
 The owner must ensure that the works are in conformance with the Migratory Bird Convention Act and that no migratory bird nests will be impacted by the proposed work no less than 48 hours prior to conducting any specified work.
